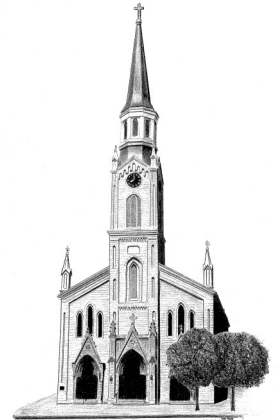

PATORS'S PEN

Celebrating the feast of St. Gaspar! The chaos and suffering of his time, St. Gaspar once said with sadness, "I am always very aware of the confusion with which we are presently faced in these miserable times of ours. I weep before God when I see the wretched situation of our times." The errors of Enlightenment, the excesses of the French revolution, the upheaval of the Napoleonic era & the cholera pandemic (1826–1837) were just a few of the problems early in the 19th century. As we are confronted with many challenges in our day, it is helpful to look to the lives of the saints. Their witness & steadfast faith are a source of courage and comfort as we hear our missionary call to be people of hope who share our faith in the Risen Lord.

On August 15, 1815 St. Gaspar del Bufalo founded the Missionaries of the Precious Blood at the old abandoned Monastery of San Felice in Giano, Italy. His congregation, formed as a Society of Apostolic Life, is bound together not by vows but by a simple promise to live the bond of charity. With a small band of missionary preachers, Gaspar began the work of renewal within the church and society. This proved to be quite challenging due to the state of chaos in the church and region following the injustices of Napoleon. In spite of these challenges, the missionary work of the congregation continued to be a reconciling and hope-filled presence for the people of God.

Bringing devotion to the Blood of Christ out of the sanctuary and into the streets, the missionaries would go out to a village or city for a couple of weeks preaching the Word of God, catechizing the people, hearing confessions and setting up systems of on-going support through lay catechists. A mission always included the presence of a ten foot tall crucifix, a picture of the Madonna of the Precious Blood and the praying of the Chaplet of the Precious Blood and the Seven Offerings of the Precious Blood composed by Fr. Albertini.

St. Gaspar preached the dignity of each person because all people have been redeemed by the Blood of Christ. He wrote, "Let us encourage each other evermore toward the pursuit of perfection and let us not cease studying the great book of the Crucifix. From that book, we learn profound humility, indomitable patience and gentle, industrious charity so that we are able to attract souls to his love." This is how each of us is called to be a stream of mercy, allowing the life-giving blood of Jesus to flow through us and out into our home, city and country.

In the summer of 1837, with as many as 200 deaths in Rome per day resulting from the cholera epidemic in the Papal States, Gaspar heard the call to minister to God's people at the expense of his own health. He died on December 28, 1837, the Feast of the Holy Innocents. The death certificate noted the cause of death as a victim of charity. St. Gaspar was canonized on June 12, 1954 and his feast day is Oct. 21st.

On this World Mission Sunday, we also lift up the life and example of St. Therese of Lisieux, co-patroness of the mission alongside St. Francis Xavier. St. Therese whose feast day is October 1st was a spiritual master of the contemplative life who heard the call to be a spiritual mother of the missions and missionaries. One day, looking at the crucifix she was "struck by the blood flowing from one of the divine hands." It gave her sorrow to see it fall to the ground without anyone gathering it up. She then was inspired to remain at the foot of the cross and to direct the blood, the stream of mercy, toward lost souls and the conversion of great sinners.

Today is our time to shine! In the midst of the physical, psychological and economic challenges of the coronavirus, the battle to protect the dignity of all life, the erosion of civil discourse in our electoral cycle, we must not fade from our call to be the voice, the hands and the heart of Jesus, his stream of mercy. This is the call we received in baptism, to continue the mission of Jesus. Even though St. Gaspar nor St. Therese ever left their homeland, they were great missionaries. Wherever we are, whether that be in a nursing home bed, our home or out in the streets, we can pray for and be a witness to the redeeming Blood of Christ, who reconciles us to the Father and to one another.
