PASTOR PEN

All of us have been called, through our baptism, to live a life rooted in Christ, to share with one another the Good News of Jesus in our daily life. We might live this vocation as a religious sister or brother, a priest or deacon. Maybe we will live this call to holiness as a husband or wife, a mom or dad. We might live this vocation as a single person. How we understand our call to live a life rooted in Christ is shaped as we discern our vocation and put our call into action.

So, it's not a question of finding out IF I have a vocation—everyone has one—the question is to identify, nurture and sustain the vocation God has given to you when he created you in his image and likeness. Growing in relationship with God means that we seek to understand how the choices we have made in life are an extension of our baptismal calling. What was the giftedness from God that called you to become the mature, faith-filled person you are today or want to be in the future? What is stirring in your heart, moving you to follow Christ more fully each day?

Today we remember all the saints, those holy men and women who share in God's gift of eternal glory. During their life on earth they were examples of Christian fidelity, trust, truth and love. Our reading from the Book of Revelation reminds us that these saints endured many challenges and sufferings, their robes being made white in the Blood of the Lamb.

But, how can the blood of the lamb make their robes white? St. John is making an obvious contradiction to make a point. The blood he is speaking about in this vision is not the blood taken in violence but blood that has been freely given out of love. Just as the blood of Jesus cleanses us from sin and death, the blood of the Lamb is able to purify that which has been harmed or desecrated in this life. These holy men and women learned that to sacrifice is to "surrender something out of love, something that is ours and is painful to give away and to let the pain of that surrender stretch and change our hearts in such a way that we are now more open to communion with God and others." (*Fr. Ronald Rolheiser, Our Great Act of Fidelity pg 53*)

The saints were not given any special advantages on how to live a holy life. Many of them struggled with the same temptations and crosses that we encounter in life. The difference is their attentiveness to God's Word, their commitment to live the sacraments of the Church and their openness to persevere in faith following Jesus who is the Way, the Truth and the Life. And so, the potential is within us to become saints!

Today we are given the beatitudes to reflect upon and to put into practice as we seek to live our call to holiness and to become saints.

- You are blessed when you are poor in spirit, when you rely on the grace of God and put God first in your life.
- You are blessed when you mourn, when you mourn for your sins and ask forgiveness of God and one another.
- You are blessed when you are meek, when you are gentle instead of being demanding and domineering.
- You are blessed when you are merciful, when you offer forgiveness and let go of past hurts.
- You are blessed when you are clean of heart, when you live your life in a way that reflects your faith.

Every time you live the blessed vision of the beatitudes you allow the holiness of God to shine through you and the saints can be heard cheering us on to the victory feast of heaven.
