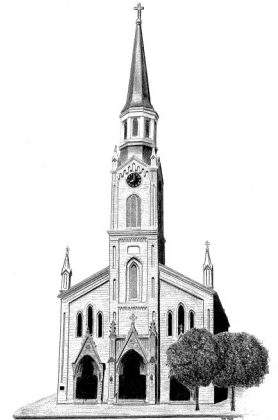

REFLECTION

As a child I remember looking forward to the annual 4th of July Independence Day festival that was sponsored by my home parish. Every year this day of food and fun ended with the traditional fireworks display. We would ooh and ahh at the bright colors and beautiful patterns of light that filled the night sky. There is something inspiring that happens when we look up at the sky and consider the expansiveness of God's creative hand. Our dreams, like the dreams of those who signed the Declaration of Independence 245 years ago, take us beyond the limits of this world and opens our hearts to the freedom that is given to us as children of God.

This freedom is not permission to do whatever I want to do. Rather, the freedom that we receive from God is to love as God loves. This is what Moses is trying to impress upon the chosen people of God. They had misused their human freedom, and this was leading them to a path of destruction.

In a similar way the American story reveals a rugged individualism which says, "Pull yourself up by your bootstraps," meaning I will succeed without any outside help. It is sung in the words of Frank Sinatra, "I did it my way!" The challenge we find is that this thinking runs counter to the Christian vision of life which is communal. We need one another to build the Body of Christ. We cannot go it alone.

Every Sunday we celebrate our freedom from sin and death, our freedom from fear, our freedom to love and to serve one another as Christ has taught us. We declare our independence from the temptation of the devil and commit "to love God with all your heart, mind and soul and to love your neighbor as yourself." (Mat. 27:37-39) The relationship we share with God and one another takes shape in the form of a covenant.

When Moses approached the people of God with "all the words and ordinances of the Lord" they agreed to do all that the Lord had told them. (Ex 24) This agreement, this unconditional covenant was sealed with the blood of life offered in sacrifice.

When Jesus gathered his disciples to share the Passover meal he gave new meaning to this covenant of love by offering the cup of the covenant sealed in His own blood, a new and everlasting covenant. The drinking of blood was something forbidden by Jewish law because blood, the source of life, was sacred to God. But what Jesus is saying is that the blood that belongs to God now belongs to the community of those who believe in Jesus and follow him. The life-force of God is now with the disciples of Jesus in a special way through his Precious Blood which binds us as one.

That is why St. Paul says, "You are no longer strangers and sojourners, but fellow citizens with the holy ones and members of the household of God." As such, we are to live the sacrificial love Jesus taught us. Being free means surrendering our lives over to God, our will, our strength, our mind. When we are dependent upon God then we are free. As the Lord said to Paul, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." (2 Corinthians 12:9)

If we limit our vision to this world alone and rely only upon our own strength, then we are trapped and simply respond to our human appetites. As a people redeemed in the Blood of Christ we are free to love as Jesus loved. When we follow the example of Christ's sacrificial love, then we will light up a darkened world in a spectacular way that leaves us standing in wonder and awe of the power of Christ at work in our lives.

"Father of all nations and ages, we recall the day when our country claimed its place among the family of nations; for what has been achieved we give you thanks, for the work that still remains we ask your help, and as you have called us from many peoples to be one nation, grant that, under your providence, our country may share your blessings with all the peoples of the earth. We ask this through Christ our Lord." Amen!

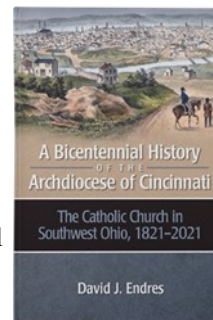
