

Staff Reflection

Rejection and Faith

Rejection is something we all experience at some point in our lives. It can come from friends, family, or even within our own communities. Even Jesus, the Son of God, faced rejection in His own hometown.

In today's Gospel, Jesus returns to Nazareth and proclaims that He is the fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecy. At first, the people marvel at His words, but then they begin to doubt. "Isn't this Joseph's son?" Unable to accept that someone so familiar could be the Messiah, so they reject Him.

Jesus did not change His message to gain acceptance. He

remained faithful to the truth and we are called to do the same. By not allowing rejection to pressure us to change, instead we should trust in God's plan and continue walking the path of discipleship. This requires humility, trust, and a willingness to accept what we may not fully understand and look beyond our own expectations and embrace God's greater plan. Then we can stand firm in our beliefs, and face opposition without becoming discouraged.

This story mirrors the struggles many people reject concerning the teachings of Christ and His Church. Not because they have truly sought understanding, but because those teachings challenge them.

When we least expect it, there will be moments that our faith will be tested. This does not define our worth, but rather our faithfulness to God. When we face hardships for Christ, we share in His suffering and are drawn closer to Him.

This week ask yourself if you are open to hearing Christ's voice, even when it challenges you? Are you allowing familiarity or doubt to cloud your faith and ignoring the truth, even when it is difficult? Let us turn to God seeking the strength to remain steadfast in our beliefs, knowing that true acceptance lies in His eternal love.



Saint Blaise Feast Day February 3, 2025

A.D. 276-316

The bishop had been arrested for his faith. He was being carted off to jail when a desperate mother placed her son at his feet. The poor boy was choking to death on a fishbone. The bishop was known for working miracles, and in his presence, the boy was instantly cured. This is the legendary story of Saint Blaise. Many legends surround his life, but they all point to a man of unshakable faith who worked incredible healings.

On his feast day, the Church offers a special blessing of throats: a priest places two crossed candles on the throats of believers and invokes Saint Blaise's healing and protection.

Where in your life do you need healing? Your marriage? Your career? Your finances? Your health? Everyone needs to be healed in some way, right now, today. Jesus is always healing someone in the Gospels. He made the blind see, gave hearing to the deaf, cured the paralyzed, and even raised the Dead.

It's easy to distance ourselves from these experiences and think we aren't the blind, deaf or lame. But we are blind. We are paralyzed. We are deaf. We are possessed. It may manifest in different ways and to different degrees, but we are. We all need to be comforted in our afflictions. We need to be counseled in our worries and anxiety. We all need to be liberated from spirits that possess us. We are all lepers in need of cleansing. We all need to be forgiven for the mistakes and sins and regrets that burden us with guilt and shame. We all need to be given a voice in situations where we find it hard to speak up. And in some way or another, some part of us, or some aspect of our lives needs to be raised from the dead. 

January 24, 2025 Memorial of St. Francis de Sales Principal Patron of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In his October 2004 apostolic letter *Mane Nobiscum Domine*, Pope St. John Paul II wrote: "[B]y our mutual love and, in particular, by our concern for those in need we will be recognized as true followers of Christ (cf. Jn. 13:35; Mt. 25:31-46). This will be the criterion by which the authenticity of our Eucharistic celebrations is judged" (28). With these words, the Holy Father underscored the divine connection between the Body and Blood of Christ that we freely receive and what we do as a result.

Like two sides of the same coin, there is an inseparable relationship for our path to salvation between God's gift of the Eucharist and our willingness to selflessly give of ourselves to others. To believe in a God that is love is also to assent that "each of us is truly called, together with Jesus, to be bread broken for the life of the world," especially for the most vulnerable among us (Benedict XVI, Sacramentum Caritatis, 88).

The Catholic Church in the United States has embarked upon the third and final stage of our Eucharistic Revival: the Year of Mission. After having so joyfully and publicly welcomed the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage to the archdiocese last year, we now remind ourselves of the mission to be Christ for others. The world needs us to shine as examples of God's love and compassion. The unborn, mothers in need, immigrants, homeless, and so many other vulnerable people long for us to see them with the eyes of Jesus, who has a special place for the poor in His heart.

In the context of Beacons of Light, the Eucharistic Revival's Year of Mission is well-expressed through the Love in Action principle. This principle encompasses our parish ministries of charity and social justice that organize our time, treasure and talents to respect human life from conception until natural death, serve those in need, welcome migrants, advocate for a more just and peaceful world, promote solidarity through global missions, create spaces of belonging for those with disabilities and care for God's creation.

The Eucharist is also a source of unity. In these relentlessly polarized times, our Love in Action ministries present a unique and prophetic witness to how we as Catholics overcome ideological, racial and social differences to advance the life and dignity of everyone. Likewise, the Eucharistic Revival Year of Mission is a welcomed opportunity for us to remind ourselves and

our communities of how powerfully this Sacrament motivates us to see all people as beloved members of one human family.

It is also fitting that the universal Church is celebrating the Jubilee Year 2025 with the theme Pilgrims of Hope. Motivated by the Eucharist to put our love into action in a divided and violent world, we all need a limitless source of hope. In his Bull of Indiction for the Jubilee, Pope Francis assures us that our Christian faith offers us in all circumstances hope in God, a hope that does not fade. "May it help us to recover the confident trust that we require," the Holy Father prays, "in the Church and in society, in our interpersonal relationships, in international relations, and in our task of promoting the dignity of all persons and respect for God's gift of creation" (Spes Non Confundit, 25).

Therefore, for this Eucharistic Revival Year of Mission during the Jubilee Year of Hope, I encourage all Families of Parishes, schools and other Catholic entities in the archdiocese to put a special emphasis on advancing Love in Action over the next five months. More details regarding ways to do this are available through the archdiocesan Office of Catholic Social Action at https://catholicaoc.org/yearofmission. We will conclude the Eucharistic Revival's Year of Mission with a Mass at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Peter in Chains on the Feast of the Ascension, Sunday, June 1, 2025, to which all of you are invited.

Thank you for all you do to be ever transformed by the Body of Christ to put God's love into action. By doing so, you are a pilgrim of hope for the local Church and all the world.



Notes from Emmanuel's Choir Loft

The Second Vatican Council tells us that Gregorian chant "should be given pride of place in liturgical services." We chant at every Mass, but many people are unfamiliar with the vast richness of chant which is an inestimable treasure; we have grown up without it, in many cases, and it can sound strange, or even dull, to our untaught ears. Recently, a choir member's enthusiasm prompted a new project idea: Once per liturgical season, we have been chanting a solemn tone Offertory in Latin, followed by a fine English rendering of the same. This Sunday you will hear "Dextera Domini..." or "The right hand of the Lord has struck with power; the right hand of the Lord has exalted me; I shall not die, but live, and declare the works of the Lord." Note especially the elaborate melisma on "exalted" contrasted with the short, powerful "I shall not die," followed immediately by the sweeter major 3rd on the word "live."


