

Pastor's Desk

In today's first reading from Isaiah, we witness Isaiah seeing a vision.

"In the year King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord seated on a high and lofty throne, with the train of his garment filling the temple. Seraphim were stationed above. They cried one to the other, "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts! All the earth is filled with his glory!"

At the sound of that cry, the frame of the door shook and the house was filled with smoke."

Seven hundred and fifty years later, we see John speaking to us in the book of Revelation. He sees the same vision. He sees angels singing, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts! Heaven and earth are filled with His glory. Hosanna in the highest."

This is why we sing this at the Mass. There are reasons for everything we do at the Mass. Mass is biblically based. In the second reading, Paul is speaking to the Corinthians. He is telling the people,

"I am reminding you, brothers and sisters, of the gospel I preached to you, which you indeed received and in which you also stand. Through it, you are also being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you, unless you believed in vain."

We are being saved through God's word. God's word changes us, heals us, and allows us to become brothers and sisters of Christ. God's word is very powerful. Just think of how much of God's word you hear when you go to Mass. That is why you are a different person when you leave the Mass. God's word and His body and blood are powerful transforming agents.

If we miss one Mass on the weekend, we are putting ourselves in a helpless state against evil.

In the gospel, Jesus allows Simon and his brother Andrew to catch a large number of fish. Jesus can do anything. He can work miracles whenever He wants. At the Mass, we see a miracle. Bread and wine changing into the body and blood of Christ. Jesus can rescue us from any situation we're in. Jesus won't make you go to Mass. He won't make you accept His miracles. Please encourage your family and relatives to go to Mass each Sunday.





The 52nd Annual March for Life

The 52nd Annual March for Life unfolded on January 24, as tens of thousands united in Washington, D.C., under this year's theme: "Life: Why We March." The event drew participants from across the nation, gathering to advocate for the dignity and protection of every human life.

Inspiring Words from Leaders and Advocates

Ahead of the march, a series of powerful speeches set the tone. Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann of Kansas City, KS, led the outdoor assembly in heartfelt prayer, asking the Holy Spirit to fill them on this "crusade for life whose origin is in [God]."

Jennie Bradley Lichter, the new president of the March for Life, addressed the crowd with a stirring reminder of their cause. "You know that the wanted-ness of a human being doesn't determine our value. You know that it is right and good to stand up for people who are too small to defend themselves," she said.

Messages from National Leaders

The event concluded with remarks from prominent political figures. In a video address, President Trump reaffirmed his administration's commitment to defending the right to life. Vice President JD Vance, baptized in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, closed the program with an optimistic vision for the future. "I want more happy children in our country. And I want beautiful young men and women who are eager to welcome them into the world and eager to raise them," he declared. A New Nativity for Generations to Come

Fundraiser Beginning for a New Emmanuel Nativity Set!

Our Nativity set at Emmanuel is beautiful but it is, in fact, different sets that have been combined over the years and at more than 40 years old, is showing its age. This year three fingers on Baby Jesus' left hand broke off and one of the kings is no longer usable at all. Other pieces are becoming more and more brittle and fragile. To this end, we are starting a fundraiser so that we can have a new Nativity ready for Christmas 2025. The new Nativity will have all the same figures with the addition (given enough donations) of an elephant and an elephant driver!

The new Nativity will be from the Demetz Art Studio of Italy. The Demetz Art Studio provided the stunning lifesize nativity set for St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York. Our Nativity will be the same scale as our current set (with 30" figures) so that it will fit in the same space we use every year on the Sacred Heart of Jesus side of the sanctuary. Figures will be hand-painted and made of sturdy fiberglass. Fiberglass is more durable than our current ceramic set which means it will last for many, many years. Additionally, the figures will be individually packaged and stored in boxes with form fitting foam to protect them in storage and while moving them back and forth from the basement.

Total Cost \$29,400

A display with photos of the individual pieces is currently in the back area of the church with an itemized list of costs. The total cost of the Nativity as proposed is \$29,400. A price increase is expected in August so we hope to order soon!


